

MESSAGE FROM CHAIR 8 CEO

As we reflect on the 2022-23 year, we continue to be buoyed by the resiliency and determination of our athletes as we return to wrestling.

Alongside the rest of the nation, we experienced the continued impacts of COVID at the start of the season, but with the persistent optimism of the community, we have come through the other end, not entirely unscathed, but with a renewed energy as we approach the Olympic year.

We are proud to be supported and led by a cohesive and committed team of staff, support personnel and partners, who work tirelessly daily alongside the athletes and coaches. We are also guided by a dedicated Board of Directors who volunteer countless hours supporting WCL's vision. The passion and dedication from everyone contributes to our achievements both on and off the mat.

Our commitment to providing a safer and more inclusive environment for our community remains, and we look to further engage with our athletes and Members to ensure that their voices are heard.

As we look back over the last year:

- Our team won 12 of 12 medals at the Commonwealth Games.
- Our athletes won two bronze medals, and two 5th places at the Senior World Championships and a 6th place for the women's team.
- Delivered two Canadian Championships, albeit postponed and the first since 2019, including a new U15 age category.
- Participated in the 2022 Canada Summer Games with great success.
- Participated in the 2023 U SPORTS Championships, after a two-year hiatus.
- The new 2022-2027 Strategic Plan, adopted by the Board of Directors and the Members lays the foundation for activities through this shortened Olympic cycle and into the next.

- Launched a new registration database and event registration system.
- Adopted the UCCMS and signed on to Abuse-Free Sport.
- Launched a governance review.
- Participated in various Olympic familiarization and preparation activities.

- Signed a new partnership agreement with FloSports as WCL's official streaming service.
- Signed a new partnership agreement with Gadar Promotions as the official merchandise provider to WCL.

We take this opportunity to note the importance and commitment of our key funding partners, including Sport Canada and the Canadian Olympic Committee, as well as other partners and sponsors. We are thankful for this support, which enables us to continue to deliver our vision.

As we continue to strengthen the foundation of governance to ensure strong and diverse leadership into the coming years, we acknowledge the efforts of the Board of Directors, staff, committees, volunteers, and the Provincial and Territorial Associations who serve as the foundation for our future athletes, coaches, officials and volunteers. Without a doubt there is more to be done, and we look forward to working collaboratively in the coming year.







FLOSPORTS




