#### **CHAMPIONSHIP ROSTER**

#### Weight Classes:

MEN - 57, 61, 65, 68, 72, 76, 82, 90, 100, and 100 to 125 kg WOMEN - 50, 53, 56, 59, 62, 65, 68, 72, 76 and 76 to 83 kg

**Teams**: Each championship team can declare up to one (1) wrestler per weight class from their most recently submitted U SPORTS Eligibility Form. Wrestlers are not allowed to move up or down from the weight class submitted to U SPORTS from the Conference Championships, notwithstanding the substitution process (see playing regulations).

#### **VENUE**

In all preliminary rounds, **four (4) official size mats** will be used (12 x 12 m) with the appropriate markings clearly visible and offering sufficient "protection area" to guard against possible injury, as per WCL's Mat Regulation Policy. The Bronze and Gold medal matches will be conducted on **two (2) official size mats** with the order of weight classes left to the discretion of the Convener.

At **Canada Games Park**, competitors will have access to warm-up mats, spin bikes, locker rooms and a nutrition table. Teams are also invited to use Brock's fitness centre, locker rooms and saunas located in the **Walker Sports Complex** on campus (approx. 10-minute walk from CGP).

#### **AWARDS**

All-Canadian and Major Awards will be awarded at the Championship Banquet on Saturday, March 1, while medal ceremonies will take place immediately following bronze and gold medal matches at Canada Games Park.

#### MEDICAL INFORMATION
